GIMME A BREAK Here are some ‘paths of entry’ into the Risties of Cm JF10. ZANAC

This is how one solver (Editor’s note – one excellent solver, nudging the Ed through A-24) got his JF breaks. An attempt to get beyond rote words and to apply previous rote learning as each crypt requires. Note that "ing and ion" paid dividends in two of the toughest four Risties. Upper case letters indicate PROPER NOUNS.

- JF A-23. It's nowhere man. K4 (96) (hipster) BION**
- JF P-11. Basic knowledge. K4 (109/20) (it is the) THE DOC**
- JF X-7 ??? Rabble rouser. K2 Romance language, no apostrophes. PARROT**
- JF X-8 Dutch Patristocrat. Behavior. (NYFOUCUF = handelen) OBOO**
- JF E-8 Ragbaby. Customary pairings. (wearing) G-MAN**
Hyphenated word is constructed as two words. First two proper nouns – Indian Goddess and civilization.
- JF SC-4 Null. Crescendo. (And) Look for word letter positions “three” beginning or end. CONFUOCO**
- JF E-17 Grandpre. The “wow” factor. Crib placement, position 121. REAL NEO**
- JF E-20 Unknown. Take your time. (mahatma) SCRYER Analyst GGMA**
This one is a Phillips, Amsco, Portax, Vigenere, Slidefair or Autokey. AAHJU’s Cm Computer Columns of 2001 and 2002 will identify it.
- JF C-4 Fourth Root. (Three words, 0-9.) GGMA**
Only “4” or “5” to the fourth power can generate the first three digit subtrahend. The remainder of this fourth root cryptarithm can be solved with simple subtractions from this point.
- JF C-Sp-1 Exponents. (Two words, 9-0.) APEX DX**
Check out all of the ciphertext letters that cannot equal zero. You will find that only **T** and perhaps, **A** (highly unlikely) may equal zero. If **T = 0**, you have a good start on the value, **HTT**.
- MA A-20. Low melting point. Find location of “the” and “that” to determine color of third word. G-MAN**
- MA P-12. Loony loons. Medicinal drug? Also look for “high.” RR TRACK**
- MA P-Sp-2. South America. South American Gorge. Three “the” appearances. GGMA**
- MA X-Sp-2. Interlingua Sudoku. (One word.) Begins “Fix.....” TWEETY**
- MA E-7. Baconian. Joy. (pen) Figure out if crib placement is under TWANGS TUNES HARPS or HARPS ELATE BRASS. CONFUOCO**
- MA C-13. Multiplication. (Two words, 0-1) Two five letter words beginning with “B” and “G.” MATANZA**
