

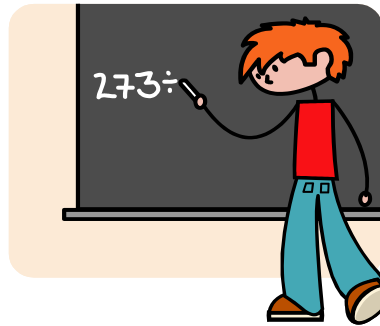

### **Patience**

- 1) Make yourself wait. The best way to practice patience is to make yourself wait. A study published in Psychological Science shows that waiting for things actually makes us happier in the long run. Start with something small, like waiting a few extra minutes to drink that milkshake and then move on to something bigger.
- 2) Stop doing things that aren't important that cause stress and make us impatient.
- 3) Be Mindful of the Things Making You Impatient. Write down what makes you impatient. This will help you slow down and focus on one task at a time.
- 4) Relax and Take Deep Breaths. Taking slow deep breaths can help calm the mind and body.

### **Atbash Cipher (10 points for solving the Atbash Cipher below)**

The Atbash Cipher is a Hebrew Cipher from 500 BC that predates the Caesar Cipher and could well have been the inspiration for Julius Caesar's better known Caesar Shift. Instead of shifting a number of letter positions to have a ciphertext letter represent a plaintext letter, the Atbash Cipher substitutes the last letter of the alphabet for the first letter, the next to the last letter of the alphabet for the second letter, and so on. Atbash encryptions are found throughout the Dead Sea Scrolls and even the Old Testament.
