The *Cm* cipher titles and accompanying cribs provide extensive openings to employ the computer research tools at our disposal to unveil vast stores of input and knowledge of the world around us while working on the solving process to uncover cipher plaintext, expanding our educational process is at our doorstep. Two such constructions follow:

MJ 2021 E-23. Trifid. Avian condos? (Ends: birdhouse) RIG R. MORTIS

Knowledge continues to abound as pencil and paper solving investigation leads us into discovering insight into the world around us. This time, the title, Avian Condos and crib (birdhouse) leads us to a Google expensive bird house in Lincoln, California and the Thunder Valley Casino Cliff Swallow construction, a bird house look-a-like pagoda, built to protect casino buildings from swallow bird infestation and provide an elegant, expensive home for the barn swallows. Google goes on to provide us much plaintext for this Trifid construction as we follow its narrative.

SO. 2020 E-16. Vigenere. Punic expansion. (LABRONICUS) (Period Thirteen) Title, crib and beginning plaintext with common trigraph open the door to Punic Wars and the interest in Carthaginian precious metals, with much plaintext to fill.

JA. X-9. Dutch Incomplete Columnar. (je leeft) PARROT: Period Five, begins “Ik” **THE DOC**

JA. X-11. Spanish Keyphrase. Love letter. (English key) (escribo) Begins “Mama” **EL CONDOR**

JA. E-3. Portax. A paradox. (QIOFXMUPY) Period Eight. Begins “The” **BION**

JA. C-7. Division. (Two words, 1-0) 1st word begins with “C.” 2nd word, three letters, begins with “P.” **LIONEL**

JA. C-14. Multiplication. (No word, 0-9) D = 0, L = 4, U = 7 **FOMALHAUT**

JA. C-Sp-1. Duodecimal Division. (Three words, 1-0) A = 4, C = 7, R = A **L’L GAMIN**

JA. AC-1322. Quagmire III. Two formative books.
MSCREP: Crib extension: “a childish fantasy that often” **SHMOO**

SO-1. Aristocrat. Get bleary eyed assigning ciphertext letters to Ornamental Icons. Steve Jobs quotation. **SILCO**
Second Icon = space.

SO. A-24. Distinction. K3. Second plaintext word used when comparing. **BARK**

SO. P-11. Representative. K3. (QBYH) (things – 2) **SERPENT SYRE**

SO. E-1. Complete Columnar. Which? (UHX) Ciphertext posted in six vertical columns. **CONFUOCO**

SO. E-2. Route Transposition. Burma Shave Road Sign. (pushing) Reverse horizontal route. **LIONEL**

SO. E-3. Gronsfeld. Life learning. (the fine) Period Eight, begins “Do” **OOBOO**

SO. E-6. Porta. It wasn’t that difficult. (the-2) PARROT: Period Six. Begins “I d-“ **ICECAP**

SO. E-8. Tridigital. Hopeful sign? (ship is) Digit 5 is separator. Crib placed at digits 9 4 8 1 and 8 9. **PELKABO**

SO. E-18. Bazeries. Joy. (railroad) Begins with “Joy;” First key digit, “3.” **LIONEL**

SO. E-19. Key Phrase. Only once. (Bond-2) James Bond did this only once in his movies. **CEREDWYN**

SO. C-3. Sudoku. (Two words *, 4th column) Begins, “Som-“ **DABASAP**

SO. C-4. Square Root. (One word, 9-0) Begins with the letter, P, ends with the letter, M. **LIONEL**

SO. C-13. Sudoku. (3 words, 5th row) Begins, “Two” **DOPEFISH**
