## Aristocrat \& Patristocrat Solving Aids.

## RISHU

RISHU tutoring spent much time on reoccurring ciphertext words, digraphs or trigraphs, exemplifying the ZANIC, Gimme A Break in each of our Newsletter issues. That, the, you, and, ing, ion, ess,, whe, who, appear often in Aristocrat and Patristocrat plaintext and can be detected by their repetitive occurrence in constructed ciphers. Cipher titles are also helpful in determining plaintext words which appear in constructions. Recent titles such as "Bold Spirit," suggest "courage and brave." "Longevity" suggests searching for an age. "Old water," opts for words such as "liquid and drink." "Canine vs. feline" pretty much begs for the appearance of cats and dogs. And the beat goes on as we innocent solvers attempt to best those devious constructors.

## The Joy of Pencil and Paper Solving.

The Cm cipher title and accompanying crib provide extensive openings to employ the computer research tools at our disposal to unveil vast stores of input and knowledge of the world around us while working on the solving process with pencil and paper to uncover additional cipher plaintext. A path to two construction decipherments follow:

## JA. 2023. A-24. Extinct marsupials. K4.

## BION

The title of this difficult Aristocrat, "Extinct marsupials," renders its difficulty into just another simple "run of the road" encipherment with its check on Google producing only one ten digit word definition of an extinct marsupial which fits into the second ten digit proper noun of the ciphertext. This allows for the recovery of sufficient plaintext to transform the solution of a difficult encipherment into one of simplicity.

## JA. 2023. E-17. Ragbaby. Recommended by George Mason. (means)

SCORPIUS
This one presents a real challenge to paper and pencil enthusiasts. First, establish the title's, George Mason's role in the founding and politicism of an early State's Commonwealth. Secondly his recommendation for the State's flag and motto which will lead you to the plaintext ending of the humorous translation of the caricature Portraying "thus always to tyrants," suggested by George Mason.
