RISHU

- 1. The most common word letter end is E.
- 2. The most common word letter beginning is T.
- 3. The most frequent two letter words, OF, TO, IN.
- 4. The most common three letter words, THE, AND.
- 5. Q is almost always followed by U.
- 6. The consonant most often following a vowel is N.
- 7. The most common double letters in regular order are LL, EE, SS, OO, FF, RR, NN, PP & CC.
- 8. The most frequently used four letter word is THAT.
