## Pencil and Paper Plaintext Letter Posting

## RISHU

Red lettering becomes an invaluable aid when posting known plaintext correctly as a crib or appearing in a keyword alphabet. It allows us to view the entire plaintext for suggestions of additional plaintext words or to make educational suppositions of keyword completions. (Editor's note - We will use the MA 23 Cm , E-10 Ragbaby Cipher, Mirthful Manipulations, as an example of how alternate letter coloring may be an aid to completing a keyword alphabet. Placement of the given crib, "induce la" extended to "induce laughter" with a an educational supposition of the cipher title leads us to an incomplete keyword of "- -IMULA-" pretty easily recognized in full as the keyword, "STIMULATE" and providing us well on the way to a plaintext solution. The alternate letter coloring of known plaintext and keyword letters proves very helpful in completing the solution.

## The Joy of Pencil and Paper Solving.

The Cm cipher title and cited common trigraph cribs provide extensive openings to employ the computer research tools at our disposal to unveil vast stores of input and knowledge of the world around us while working on the solving process with pencil and paper to uncover additional cipher plaintext. A path to a construction decipherment follows:
