One Man's Philosophy

APEX DX's cipher, "One Man's Philosophy," K GJX EBJM K GJX JQL MBJM'H JVV K GJX. *CZCTGT posted on the chalk board of a Physical Science Club for an after-class Mathematics' club, meeting later that afternoon, who had been exploring statistics of letter distribution in newspapers and other prose sources exhibited his passion for cipher sharing: "That afternoon in my Physical Science class an astute young woman student had experienced a "Eureka moment," calling out joyously and correctly identifying its solution. The joke had to be on me. You don't pose an unkeyed, overly brief (33 letters) substitution cipher as necessarily solvable, though this one had been just that. I asked if the MBJM'H had been the elegant giveaway but she replied that the **CZCTGT** had been her solution route."

The Joy of Pencil and Paper Solving.

The *Cm* cipher title and cited common trigraph cribs provide extensive openings to employ the computer research tools at our disposal to unveil stores of input and knowledge of the world around us while working on the solving process with pencil and paper to uncover additional cipher plaintext. A path to two decipherments follow:

MJ 2024. E-26 Digrafid. Stanza 1. (-thinwardnesshiseyesar-)

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Let's save us a bit of work on the lengthy to solve Digrafid Cipher. The title of this cipher (Stanza 1) suggests a poem to be uncovered. And uncovered it will be, with just a bit of an extension to the given crib. Extending the crib to "withinwardness his eyes are' leads us directly to a Robert W, Service poem with all of the plaintext needed to completely solve this nasty Digrafid Cipher.
