Solving TIPS RISHU

- **T Title** Do not overlook the cipher title as a good source for potential plaintext word in the cipher text. A case in point is illustrated by our sample cipher.
  - **The** Keep on the lookout for repetitive three letter CIPHERTEXT (trigraphs) repeats which could signal the existence of the word "the" in the plaintext.
- **I − IQ −** Sorry, but this is the only way I can slip the letter "Q" into our FEW POCKET TIPS acronym. The letter "q" is usually followed by the letter, "u" and then by a vowel, "a, e, i, or o."
- **P Position of letters** Most popular letter positions in a word **a**, first or next to last; **e**, second or next to last or last; **i**, third from end; **o**, second; **u**, first or next to the last; **y**, last.
- **S Short words –** Keep an eye out for these short words in, it, is, of, no, on, and, the

## The Joy of Pencil and Paper Solving.

The *Cm* cipher title and cribs provide extensive openings to employ the computer research tools at our disposal to unveil stores of input while working on the solving process with pencil and paper to uncover additional cipher plaintext. Check out the **JA Cm E-1 Checkerboard** by **WORD WIZARD** which title suggests advertising in verse, and crib offers "oncoming". Burma Shave fits nicely at the cipher's end and a check on Google of the Burma Shave ads will supply the line for "oncoming cars," leading to much additional plaintext.
